# ATTENDANCE CELEBRATION

Since the last newsletter our whole school attendance achieved another record day. Our previous record of 92% of students at school for the day has increased to 93%. We celebrated with another round of ice blocks. Well done Wiri Central! Let's keep our attendance rate in the 90s. If we can better 93% we will have another ice block day.

### PAID UNION MEETING FOR TEACHERS (NZEI - EDUCATION WORKERS UNION)

Teachers in our school will be attending a paid union meeting on Thursday 21 March. NZEI Te Riu Roa leaders are calling paid union meetings for members to discuss and consider important issues, including how members might collectively:

- Ensure the historic Mana Taurite | pay equity process properly values the skills, and intellectual and emotional effort of our work as teachers
- Shape union priorities for 2024

We ask that students finish school at 12.30pm on Thursday 21 March to uphold the right of teachers to participate in their union meeting while also ensuring the least disruption to your children's learning. Students will eat their school lunches prior to going home at 12.30pm.

### **ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

Students are not permitted to bring electronic devices (computers, phones, ipads etc) to school. If your child brings a device to school we will require it to be handed into the office and you will be contacted to come and collect it. Devices to support student learning at school are available and planned as part of classroom teaching programmes.

#### **SWIMMING**

The Pools iN SchoolZ portable pool is about to be filled and ready for swimming. Learning to swim and water safety skills are not only a part of the Health and Physical Education curriculum, but an important life skill. It is unacceptable that so many people drown in New Zealand every year. Developing water confidence and learning to swim helps to reduce the risk of drowning. Please support your child to bring their swimming gear on their scheduled swimming day.

The pool is heated and covered and life jackets are available for use by smaller/younger students if required. As well as bringing their togs and a towel students need to bring a plastic bag to keep their belongings in. Shorts and tee shirts/singlets are suitable for use in the pool.

We require spotters to assist with swimming. Spotters are an extra pair of eyes watching the students while the teacher is taking the swimming lesson. If you are available to be a spotter, please let your child's teacher know. All classes must have at least one spotter to be able to swim.

All students are expected to participate in swimming - it is part of the compulsory school curriculum. If there is a medical reason why your child cannot participate in swimming please inform the class teacher or the office by phone call, text, email or a written note.
