SAFETY AT THE SCHOOL GATE

As our school roll increases we have more students arriving at and leaving school each day. Keeping our students safe from traffic hazards is an important responsibility that we all need to share.

Cars stopping on the yellow lines outside the school gate, stopping in the middle of the crossing, pulling into the school driveway and backing out, or sneaking into the school car park all create hazards for other vehicles and are dangerous for children leaving school. We do not want to see any of our children hurt.

To keep all of our children safe we ask that parents/caregivers please use the car park beside the Wiri Community Hall (on Inverell Ave) to drop off and pick up students. The hall car park is only a short walk from the back gate (behind Room 17) and is located well away from the road and traffic hazards. **Please do not drive into the school grounds. This is for staff parking only.**

We also ask that adults please use the patrolled crossing on Inverell Ave when crossing with their children. Your good example helps keep our children safe.

ONLINE BULLYING

Last week I became aware of an incident of online bullying (cyberbullying) that I believe was initiated by a student from our school. This has been reported to both Netsafe and the police. As this online bullying is occurring outside of school we have no control over it. I am asking your support to help us keep our students safe.

At school students are not able to access any social media platforms. Social media accounts are restricted to people 13 years or older. As only a very small portion of our school students fall into this age group we block all access to these sites at school. However, we know that sometimes students are accessing these platforms outside of school.

Parents, please be aware of what your children are doing online. What sites are they visiting? Who are they connecting with? What are they posting?

Take control - Block people who make inappropriate comments so they cannot continue to do so and report serious concerns. You can report concerns and find further information and advice on the Netsafe website - netsafe.org.nz

At school when we receive specific information about inappropriate online activity we will contact the parents of students involved and/or report the incident to Netsafe and the police. We include lessons about appropriate online behaviour and strategies to keep safe online in our classroom programmes.

The internet, devices and social media all provide lots of positive opportunities for connecting and learning; however we all have a responsibility to use them appropriately and safely. As educators and parents we need to work together to teach our children how to be responsible digital citizens. I thank you for your support.
