ATTENDANCE MATTERS

One of our school goals is to increase student attendance. It is important that children attend school regularly, at least 90% of the time.

The Ministry of Education classifies attendance into the following categories:

- Regular attendance where students attend more than 90% of the term
- Irregular absence where students attend more than 80% and up to 90% of the term
- Moderate absence where students attend more than 70% and up to 80% of the term
- Chronic absence where students attend 70% or less of the term

You will have seen your child's attendance percentage on their recent mid-year report. Which category does your child fall into? Our goal is for all children to achieve regular attendance. To achieve this students need to miss no more than 18 school days across the year (4-5 days per term). Regular attendance is important if children are to make progress in their learning and maintain relationships with their peers.

In 2024 our target is for at least 45% of students to achieve 90% or greater attendance. In Term 1, 53% of students achieved 90% or greater attendance. In Term 2, 42% of students achieved 90% or greater attendance. We congratulate the 154 students who achieved this goal. Thank you to the families/whānau who have supported children to achieve this great result. Most of these students were acknowledged for their efforts with a special treat last Friday afternoon. Those who were on trips will receive their treat this week.


The captain steers the wheel of the yacht in the stern of the boat. Hyla
