ATTENDANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN TERM 1

An important goal in our school strategic plan is to increase student attendance. It is important that children attend school regularly. The Ministry of Education defines regular attendance as more than 90% of the time. Regular attendance is important if children are to make progress in their learning and maintain relationships with their peers. All students need to be present at school so they can participate and engage in learning. Students with high levels of attendance are more likely to succeed in their learning. We want every student to succeed in learning.

In Term 1 we had 181 students who attended school regularly (more than 90% of the time). These students enjoyed a yummy ice block treat on the last day of term to acknowledge their great attendance. Additionally, 58 students attended school **every** day last term. This is an outstanding achievement. To acknowledge this achievement these students will receive a special ice cream sundae treat in the staffroom this Friday. They will also receive a certificate at our school assembly on Friday. Assembly will be held at the usual time of 2.15pm, parents, you are welcome to join us for the assembly.
