
FA'AFETAI TELE LAVA BBM

IMPROVING ATTENDANCE

Increasing student attendance is one of the two major goals of our school strategic plan. It is important that children attend school regularly. Regular attendance is important if children are to make progress in their learning and maintain relationships with their peers. The Ministry of Education defines regular attendance as being at school more than 90% of the time. All students need to be present at school so they can participate and engage in learning. Students with high levels of attendance are more likely to succeed in their learning. We want every student to succeed in learning.

To let you know how we are going, we will be sharing our attendance data with you in each newsletter. Below is the attendance for Wiri Central School students for the first two weeks of this term. When we see the REGULAR section of the graph getting bigger, we will know attendance is improving.



At school we already implement a

number of initiatives to support and encourage regular attendance:

- Weekly certificates awarded to classes for every day the class has all students present. When classes have earned 5 certificates they get to choose a brand new board game to have in their classroom.
- 100% attendance award for all students who attend school every day for the term. As well as a certificate
 the students are invited to have an ice cream sundae treat in the staffroom
- On the last day of each term every student that achieves regular attendance (over 90%) for the term receives an ice block

Last week, we introduced another incentive. Every two weeks, every student who has attended school every day for that fortnight, will have their name entered into a prize draw.
